



CHATEAU MOULIN DE LA HARGUE

Appellation: Médoc

Soil: Fine gravel on a layer of impermeable clay

Varietals: Cabernet Sauvignon 70%

Merlot 20%

Cabernet Franc 10%

Surface: 11 hectares

Age of vines: 35 years old on average, some date

back to 1956

Aging: 10 months in vats

Tasting

Deep, bright ruby-red colour. Elegant aromas of red berries and under-wood come together very nicely with subtle notes of spices. The tannins are present but not dominating: the wine is rich and well-balanced.

Serving conditions: Room temperature (19°) Pairings: red meat, poultry, cheese

Origin

Located in the top north of Médoc appellation. La Hargue is a place name; from there, several windmills could be seen before. This wine is the true expression of the complexity of the Médoc terroir: back-bone and elegance at the same time.
